

The Big Bang: Free Oldham Edge, Tuesday November 5

Oldham's hugely-popular Civic Bonfire event is moving to a spectacular new venue.

After returning in style in 2012, this year's event – dubbed The Big Bang! – is taking place at a new site on Tuesday, November 5.

Oldham Edge, with its sprawling grass parkland close to the town centre, has been chosen to play host to an evening of free family fun.

Boasting panoramic views across Manchester and beyond it means the fireworks display could be seen by residents from miles around.

First Choice Homes Oldham (FCHO), which has many tenants neighbouring the site and the surrounding areas as part of its 12,000-home stock, is sponsoring the event.

Last year's event – the first time it had been held in over a decade - drew around 14,000 spectators to Boundary Park and was deemed a huge success, but a new venue was needed due to redevelopment work at Oldham Athletic.

The Big Bang! will again feature a range of family-oriented attractions

There will be another stunning professional display from Fantastic Fireworks as the centrepiece of the night with a sparkling mix of traditional favourites and a real we factor.

There will also be a small bonfire, street entertainers, family games and activities, plus food stalls selling traditional autumn grub. No alcohol will be on sale on the site.

Plans are again being shared with Greater Manchester Fire and Rescue Service and Greater Manchester Police to help maximise public safety on Bonfire Night.

To help cater for parking demand, Oldham Council is also offering the use of all its town centre car parks free of charge on the day from 3pm onwards.

Bonfire Night: 5 Tips to stay safe

The best way to stay safe on Bonfire Night is to attend a professionally organised event.

But if you still want to use your own fireworks then follow these top tips...

- Children Always supervise children around fireworks
- Fireworks Buy fireworks from a reputable retailer and keep them in a sealed tin
- Sparklers Wear gloves and never give them to a child under 5 years old
- Bonfires Keep bonfires well away from houses, trees, fences and overhead cables
- Water Have a bucket of water nearby if setting fireworks off in your garden

- Child Tax Credit (provided you are not entitled to Working Tax Credit) and have an annual income (as assessed by Her Majesty's Revenue and Customs) that does not exceed the current year's level

- The Guarantee element of State Pension Credit
- Working Tax Credit during the four-week period immediately after your employment finished, or after you start to work less than 16 hours per week

Be bright morning and night

Stay safe in Winter



Child pedestrian road accidents are most likely to happen in mornings and afternoons on Winter week days. When the clocks go back, the nights draw in and the winter weather arrives, road conditions and visibility can be at their worst

As a pedestrian or cyclist you may see the driver but they might not see you. Even during daylight, because the sun is low in winter, drivers might not be able to see you.

So as the nights draw in and the mornings get darker, we want to remind parents and children to be safe and be seen by following these simple tips.

- Make sure you're visible to other road users and pedestrians
- Keep away from the kerb
- Wear bright or fluorescent clothing in daylight or poor light
- Wear reflective clothing at night; it shows up in car headlights. Fluorescent clothing is not so visible after dark
- Always use your lights when cycling after dark, in the rain or if the weather is overcast

Free Early Education for your child



Free early education entitlement

Children deserve the best start in life and early education allows them to develop through exploration, play and social interaction while giving them the knowledge they need to start school.

Early education for your child can also give you the opportunity to spend more time with older children in your family, allows you to return to work, volunteer, study for a qualification or hobby or just have some 'you' time.

Is your child accessing his/her 15 hours a week free early education?

2 year old early education

From September 2013, your two year old child could be eligible for 15 hours of free early education at any Ofsted registered childcare provider that is eligible to receive funding.

Your child will be eligible if you receive:

- income support
- income-based Jobseeker's Allowance (JSA)
- income-related Employment and Support Allowance (ESA)
- support through part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum Act
- the guaranteed element of State Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (but not Working Tax Credit) and have an annual income not over £16,190
- The Working Tax Credit 4-week run on (the payment you get when you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit)

2 year olds who are looked after by the local authority are also eligible for 15 hours of free early education.

To check if you are eligible and to claim your child's free education entitlement, please contact your local children's centre, or visit

www.oldham.gov.uk/childrens_centres You may be asked for proof of eligibility.

3-4 year old early education

All 3 and 4 year old children can receive 15 hours of free early education at any Ofsted registered provider that is eligible to receive funding. The free entitlement offers universal free early education from the term following your child's third birthday until they reach compulsory school age.

This entitlement is for every child, no matter what their background or family circumstance.

Be brave and beat the bullies

Bullying is a big concern for many parents and carers. Knowing or suspecting that your child is being bullied, or being a bully themselves, can be very upsetting. But there are things you can do to help tackle the problem.

If your child tells you that they're being bullied, the first thing to do is listen. The NSPCC advises parents to let children tell their story in their own words, reassure them and keep a diary of bullving incidents.

How do I know if my child is being bullied?

It is crucial to be alert to the possibility of bullying and there are signs to look out for.

These include...

- Coming home with damaged clothing or with scratches and bruises
- Not attending school or using a different route home
- Having trouble with homework for no obvious reason
- Feeling irritable or being easily upset and emotional

Talk to your school about bullying

It's essential for you or your child, or both together, to talk to the school. Discuss with your child who to approach first as there may be a particular teacher they feel more at ease with.

Today all our schools are required to have an Anti-Bullying Policy and it is important that parents and schools work together to take action.

If bullying is happening outside school, consider contacting the family of the child who is bullying and try to find a



way to work together to sort it out.

Online bullying (Cyber bullying)

Online bullying (cyber bullying) is when a person or a group of people uses the internet, email, online games or any other kind of digital technology to threaten, tease, upset or humiliate someone else. Online bullying can feel like there's no escape as it can happen 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

Remember to keep a copy of any abusive texts, emails, comments or messages that your child receives and record the date and time they were sent. With online bullying there is always a trail and keeping records can be very useful when it comes to reporting the bullying.

Make sure your child does not reply to any messages they receive. It will only encourage the bullies and end up causing your child more upset.

What if I think my child is a bully?

Bullies who continually harm other children need support and help as well. They may have experienced difficulties of their own which may have led to their actions. Reporting your concerns may help them to get help as well.

Flu Protecting your family

As the nights draw in and winter approaches, it is time to consider flu and what catching it could mean to your family.

Flu is highly infectious with symptoms that come on very quickly. It can be a very unpleasant illness causing fever. stuffy nose, dry cough, sore throat, aching muscles and joints. and extreme tiredness, often lasting for several days. Some people can also get a very high fever, sometimes without the usual flu symptoms, and may need to go to hospital for treatment. Complications of flu can include bronchitis, pneumonia, a painful ear infection and in extreme cases even death.

The best way to protect your family is by having the vaccination before the flu season starts.

People who are at increased risk from flu are entitled to a free vaccination each year.

Pregnant women, people aged 65 and over and those with some existing conditions, such as heart problems and kidney disease fall into those categories.

This year, all children who were aged two and three on 1 September 2013 can have free flu vaccine given as a nasal spray up each nostril. An annual flu vaccine for children is available on the NHS for all two and three year olds.

Your GP will contact you to let you know how to book an appointment for your child.


