Welcome to Gallery Oldham

Our extensive programme includes exhibitions, events, courses and talks, as well as popular family activities and schools workshops.

In the Galleries

Gallery Oldham has four main exhibition spaces on the second floor. Oldham Stories is a permanent gallery space devoted to displaying our collections, while the Community Gallery features work by local artists and groups.

Around the Building

Several major pieces from our collection are on permanent display. These include John Collier's monumental painting of The Death of Cleopatra, Peter Philip's important Pop Art work Gravy for the Navy and a vintage Bradbury motorbike.

The Oldham Panorama is a unique large-scale photograph of the town in 1876. Explore the drawers beneath the picture to uncover objects from our collections.

On the first floor landings you'll find objects from our Social History and Natural History collections. Curated by staff and visitors the What's in Store displays include everyday objects from the past and taxidermy specimens.

Gallery Gardens

The Gardens around the Gallery encourage a variety of wildlife – from nectar-rich flowers to encourage insects, to a log pile to tempt other mini-beasts, and feeders for birds. Take the time to explore on your visit.



Last Chance to See...

Revolution in the Bedroom, War in the Playground: Video Gaming 1979–1989

Until 1 November

Explore the early years of the digital revolution, when gaming became accessible for the first time. There is original artwork by Oliver Frey who designed covers and posters for video games and the chance to see historic machines, including the classic ZX81 home computer!

Designs on our Future Ongoing exhibition

We're looking to the future with plans for a new Theatre and Heritage Centre in Oldham well underway. The scheme aims to bring the old library building back into use and develop surrounding land to create a vibrant cultural hub for Oldham.

This is your chance to keep up to date with our progress, see the architect's drawings and hear all about our plans. Photographer Ian Beesley and poet Ian McMillan have also been looking at this project and their creative responses are on display.

The project was awarded development funding by the Heritage Lottery Fund and Arts Council England in 2012. Since then we've been developing the concept with the aim of applying for further funding.

Our initial conversations with a range of people from architects to artists, quantity surveyors to local teenagers - have brought us a long way and now we'd like you to tell us what you think.

Jerwood Makers Open

15 November 2014 - 1 March 2015

The annual Jerwood Makers Open is a major commission that gives early career artists £7,500 each to develop new work and take artistic risks.

Chosen from over 240 applications, the selected makers include two collaborative duos for the first time in the award's history. The artists offer a range of projects across different disciplinary backgrounds, from architecture and spatial design to more traditional craft-based skills in ceramics and glass.

This year the artists selected are ceramicists Hitomi Hosono and Matthew Raw, artists Revital Cohen and Tuur Van Balen, glass artist Shelley James and spatial storytellers FleaFollyArchitects. Between them they are experimenting with material, technical, conceptual and narrative concerns.

From a modern day Tower of Babel to a full sized pub front the result is a fascinating and varied exhibition by makers pushing the boundaries of their craft.

Black Sheep

14 February - 9 May 2015

Felt is the most ancient constructed textile in the world and has been used for everything from cosy winter garments to conceptual art. This exhibition is an exploration of the edgier side of this extraordinary and versatile material, looking at artists who create sometimes disturbing and bizarre oddities and technically brilliant objects.

It presents some of the exciting and sometimes surprising processes used by contemporary masters of the craft to produce innovative and inspiring work. Visitors will discover felt teddy bear skulls and mutated organisms by Stephanie Metz, seamless showstopping garments by Horst Couture and sculptural natural forms by Marjolein Dallinga.

Solar Flowers – Alexandre Dang

15 March – Summer 2015

Artist Alexandre Dang has displayed his dancing Solar Flowers around the world. They have become an iconic work testifying to his commitment to the power of renewable energy. The light, bright space of our central gallery will allow the flowers to be seen at their very best.

Alexandre Dang comes from a scientific background and uses solar energy to animate his kinetic art works whilst also raising awareness of the potential of environmentally friendly technologies. Though the sun provides 10,000 times more energy to the earth than humans need, more than 1.7 billion people still do not have access to electricity. Dang is a founder of Solar Solidarity International (a non-profit international association) to support solar electrification of schools in developing countries.

Visitors may be both charmed by the flowers and awed by the power of the sun. After the exhibition the flowers will be on sale from the Gallery shop.

200 Years on Union Street

Until 31 January 2015

Union Street in Oldham was first laid out in the early 1800s. This quiet country lane was intended as a by-pass for travellers to avoid the steep route through the town centre. Now the new Metrolink route brings visitors along this busy street every day.

Using objects and paintings from our collections this exhibition charts the buildings and people that have shaped Union Street over the years. There's a wealth of material to explore - from the original doors of the Odeon Cinema to a World War I roll of honour recording the sacrifices of employees from the Prudential's offices.

Oldham Art School was based in The Lyceum for many years. You can see works by painters William Stott and contemporary artist Brian Clarke who each learnt their craft here.

As well as family friendly activities we also want your memories of Union Street. So if you learnt to swim in the town's first public baths or had your first pint at the Bath Hotel we'd love to hear your stories.

4 October – 15 November

Matombo Tombo is an Oldham based group of stone carvers of British and Zimbabwean heritage. This exhibition demonstrates what can happen when stone mined in Zimbabwe and Shona stone carving traditions and techniques are introduced into an Oldham setting.

Gordon Clegg: Face the World

22 November – 3 January

This exhibition is a collection of portraits of peoples from around the world. Wherever we live the face is our identity and our means of communication. In today's diverse communities, Gordon's work celebrates the one thing we all have in common, our face.



Claire Mather: Sketches in Stitches

Claire's work is an exploration of drawing with stitch based on local landscapes and architecture. Using an individual approach to the traditional expectations of textile art, each piece has a sketched or drawn look with a modern twist that translates into truly unique art.

We deliver a comprehensive educational programme for learners of all ages. Central to the Gallery's work is an innovative and engaging cross-curricular programme for schools and higher education. Workshops cover all areas of the curriculum and focus on our Art, Craft, Social and Natural History collections.

Artist-led sessions for schools

Our fantastic new range of artist-led sessions have been very popular with schools and we have created a range of inspiring new workshops for the autumn winter term.

The wide range of workshops cover all ages and areas of the new curriculum, drawing inspiration from our diverse range of collections and exhibitions. All artistled workshops are two hours long and charged at $\pounds100$ for classes of up to 35 pupils.
